Early Learning

\$8.5M Create a Department of Early Childhood Development • Effective July 1, 2021 • Independent Department under the California Health and Human Services Agency (CHHS) • Promotes high-quality, affordable, and unified early childhood system that improves program integration and coordination with other major programs serving young children. • The California Department of Education will continue to administer California State Preschool Program (CSPP) • \$8.5M is to establish a Transition Team at CHHS and to support staffing Support creation of 621 new General Child Care slots \$10.3M • Continues funding of 3,000 General Child Care slots created in 2019 Shifts funding from General Fund to Cannabis Fund 2.29% COLA for childcare program reimbursement rates Preschool \$31.9M Fund 10,000 New full-day CSPP slots • All slots located at locations other than K-12 schools (non-LEA) Creates slots beginning April 1, 2021 • Provides \$127M in ongoing funding 2.29% COLA for preschool program reimbursement rates \$150M Support construction of preschool facilities on school campus • Roll over funding from 2019 full-day kindergarten conversion

Special Education

\$75M Additional funding for Inclusive Early Education Expansion Program



- Created with one-time Prop 98 funds as part of 2018-19 budget to increase access to Early Learning programs for children with disabilities
- Funds are for LEAs to build or modify facilities

Early Childhood Health and Wellness

\$10M Development of an Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACES) Cross-Sector Training Program

- Accredited through Office of the Surgeon General
- Surgeon General to consult with experts to develop a series of trauma-informed trainings for key sectors, including early childhood
- Will also include a statewide public awareness campaign
- One-time funding
