

County Childcare COVID-19 Initiatives in California Updated May 28, 2020

This summary from Early Edge California details how our state is providing resources to families and providers at the county level.

Alameda County

 - Centers are open 7:30am 6pm, Monday-Friday.
 - Centers offer a variety of indoor and outdoor activities, including sports, art, and STEM projects.
 - Boys & Girls Clubs of San Francisco, the Telegraph Hill Neighborhood Center, and the YMCA of San Francisco are also offering emergency child and youth care.
